CURRENT PRIORITIES

- Elevating the discussion on the 75 percent goal for credit instruction taught by full-time faculty; achieving parity pay for part-time faculty, through a legislative resolution
- Expanding the provision of mental health services through the budget and/or legislative process
- Increasing fairness in the appeals process for students losing their Board of Governors Fee Waiver, through legislation
- Increasing dedicated funding for full- and part-time faculty in the Budget Act
- Increasing the base allocation for community colleges in the Budget Act

HIGHLIGHTS OF PRIOR LEGISLATIVE ACHIEVEMENTS

1970s

- Creation of Academic Senate
- Introduction of collective bargaining in the community colleges

1980s

- FACCC cosponsored AB 1725 (Vasconcellos), the major community college reform bill, resting the System from its K-12 roots. Among its major provisions, AB 1725 dealt with shared governance, full-time faculty hiring and professional development.

1990s

- FACCC-sponsored AB 3099 (Campbell) established the Part-Time Faculty Health Benefits program; AB 301 (Cunneen), formed a program for Part-Time Faculty Office Hours.
- FACCC and the Los Angeles College Faculty Guild cosponsored AB 2804 (Honda), AB 1102 (Knox), AB 1150 (Prenter) and SB 1528 (Schiff), increased CalSTRS benefits by an average of \$600 per month for faculty members retiring after January 1, 1999.

2000s

- FACCC cosponsored AB 420 (Wildman) led to improvement in Part-Time Faculty Office Hours and Health Benefits, and creation of the equity fund.
- FACCC was instrumental in reconstituting the Californians for Community Colleges; led to qualification of Proposition 92, the Community College Initiative.

2010s

- Sponsored AB 1741 that persuaded the inclusion of improved ratio of counselors to students, greater funding for student support services, increased full-time hours of credit instruction and expanded part-time faculty hours in what became the Student Success Act law.
- Sponsored AB 404 provided a mechanism for faculty and other community college stakeholders to give feedback on the System's accreditor.
